

# INTERNATIONALIZATION STRATEGY 2023-2030 UNIVERSIDAD DE LA FRONTERA

This Internationalization Strategy will be part of UFRO's next Strategic Development Plan 2023-2030, which will be reviewed by the respective collegial bodies.



#### CONTEXT

The Internationalization Strategy of Universidad de La Frontera (UFRO) follows a comprehensive approach and thus, involves all university activities. For the construction of this Strategy. we defined what makes us unique and how we want to position ourselves locally, nationally, and internationally. Based on a self-assessment about our university's internationalization level and consultancies from international universities within similar environments, we co-designed the Strategy with the support of an Internationalization Strategy Advisory Committee, key actors of the university and the whole university community. A participatory process was guaranteed through distinct work and feedback sessions, as well as validation mechanisms.

This Strategy will enable UFRO to advance in internationalization, positioning itself as a university of excellence in the education of individuals and the co-generation of knowledge, connected to global challenges through strategic international partnerships, from a perspective based on our cultural and territorial wealth.

This document presents the main objectives of the Strategy and the proposed actions to achieve these institutional goals by 2030.

We have identified graduate programs as a priority axis for the internationalization of our university. We will promote the training of advanced human capital capable of joining international networks and enhancing scientific collaborations.


#### EXCELLENCE TRAINING WITH AN INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVE
